# RACINE COUNTY COVID-19 UPDATE April 16, 2020

### Overview

Gov. Tony Evers today directed Wisconsin Department of Health Services (DHS) Secretarydesignee Andrea Palm to extend the Safer at Home order from April 24, 2020 to 8 a.m. Tuesday, May 26, 2020, or until a superseding order is issued. The order implements some new measures to ensure safety and support the progress made in containing COVID-19, but also allows certain activities to start up again. K-12 schools in the state will remain closed through the end of the 2019-20 school year. The order is available at <u>HERE</u>. ### **Racine County**

Racine County announced a new Senior Nutrition initiative that will provide another meal option for homebound seniors while giving restaurants an opportunity for additional business during the COVID-19 outbreak. The Racine County Senior Nutrition program is seeking to contract with approximately 12 local restaurants to provide delivered and curb-side meals to seniors who are homebound due to COVID-19 social distancing requirements. ### **Central Racine County Health Department**

In response to the COVID-19 public health emergency, the Wisconsin Department of Health Services is temporarily changing program rules, including suspending BadgerCare Plus children and Medicaid Purchase Plan (MAPP) premiums as of April 1, 2020.
