RACINE COUNTY COVID-19 UPDATE **April 27, 2020**

Confirmed coronavirus cases

United States: 980,008

Wisconsin: 6,081

Central Racine County Health Department: 134 confirmed (plus 46 probable); 8 deaths

City of Racine Health Department: 171 confirmed (plus 37 probable); 4 deaths

Racine County total: 305 confirmed (plus 83 probable); 12 deaths

The Racine County/RAMAC task force on reopening businesses -- called "Rebound Racine County" -- held its initial meeting today via teleconference. The task force includes a diverse mix of representatives from businesses, nonprofits, government and public health. The group is expected to produce recommendations by early May on how local businesses can reopen safely.

While Racine County parks are open, just a reminder to maintain social distancing of at least 6 feet and do not visit parks if you are sick. Your cooperation is vital to the success of our parks and the health of our communities.
