The community testing site at Festival Hall (5 Fifth Street) in Racine continues this week. Testing will take place as follows:

- Tuesday, May 26 Friday, May 29: 11:30am to 7:30 pm
- <u>Saturday, May 30</u>: 11:00 am to 5:00 pm.

The City of Racine has updated demographic and COVID-19 count data which can be found <u>HERE</u>. The number of cases in the City's jurisdiction is now 1,057 which is almost a 20% increase in the number of cases from Friday.
