RACINE COUNTY COVID-19 UPDATE **June 5, 2020**

Confirmed coronavirus cases

United States: 1,886,555

Wisconsin: 20,249

Central Racine County Health Department: 573 confirmed, 129 probable, 7,832 negative, 29 deaths

City of Racine Health Department: 1,333 confirmed, 167 probable, 7,163 negative, 17 deaths

Racine County total: 1,906 confirmed, 296 probable, 14,955 negative, 46 deaths

Positive test percentage: 11.3%

Another COVID-19 community testing site, operated by the Wisconsin National Guard, will be held at Horlick High School (2119 Rapids Drive, Racine) from June 15-19. Testing will be available 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. each day.

Total case counts in the United States are at about 21,000 new cases per day, down from a peak of 30,000 new cases per day in April. However, this does not mean it is time to let our guard down. Hot spots of activity in the Midwest (including Wisconsin) and the rural south are still seeing sharp case increases and unsteady transmission patterns. This is an ongoing reminder to continue maintaining social distancing, practice good hand hygiene, and wear a facemask or cover when out in public or working around others.
