## RACINE COUNTY COVID-19 UPDATE January 4, 2020

### Confirmed coronavirus cases

United States: 20,739,217 confirmed, 352,620 deaths

Wisconsin: 487,938 confirmed, 2,365,680 negative, 4,884 deaths

Central Racine County Health Department: 9,234 confirmed (+190 from last week), 1,296 probable (+35), 58,191 negative (+126), 159 deaths (+1)

City of Racine Health Department: 7,233 confirmed (+222 from last week), 837 probable (+31), 41,935 negative (+219), 89 deaths (+2)

Racine County total: 16,467 confirmed (+412 from last week), 2,133 probable (+66), 100,126 negative (+345), 248 deaths (+3)

### Updates for the week of January 4:

- Beginning this week, the Wisconsin National Guard will conduct drive-thru COVID-19 testing sites in Racine County at the following locations:
  - Wednesdays, Jan. 6 through March 10, 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. at the Racine County Fairgrounds, 19805 Durand Ave., Union Grove. Vehicles should enter the fairgrounds from Main Street.
  - Thursdays, Jan. 7 through March 4, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. at Festival Hall, 5 Fifth St., Racine. Vehicles should enter at 11th Street and Main Street.
- Residents who are experiencing COVID-19 symptoms, were in close contact with someone sick with COVID-19, or who recently attended a gathering are encouraged to get tested. Those getting tested at the drive-thru locations are strongly encouraged to pre-register by visiting [register.covidconnect.wi.gov](https://register.covidconnect.wi.gov).
