RACINE COUNTY COVID-19 UPDATE January 19, 2021

Confirmed coronavirus cases

United States: 24,163,707 confirmed, 400,022 deaths

Wisconsin: 524,402 confirmed, 2,445,399 negative, 5,512 deaths

Central Racine County Health Department: 10,092 confirmed (+271 from last week), 1,519 probable (+75), 60,406 negative (+747), 182 deaths (+6)

City of Racine Health Department*: 7,643 confirmed (+410 from last week), 922 probable (+85), 42,932 negative (+425), 94 deaths (+1)

Racine County total: 17,735 confirmed (+681 from last week), 2,441 probable (+153), 103,338 negative (+1,172), 276 deaths (+7)

Updates for the week of January 19:

- The Wisconsin Department of Health Services announced today that adults age 65 and older will soon be eligible for the vaccine. For more information, [see the DHS news release](#).
- The Central Racine County and City of Racine Health Departments are currently assisting in vaccinations of health care workers and other front-line personnel. (This phase is known as Phase 1A). Law enforcement in Racine County began getting vaccinated this week. The departments will move into Phase 1B upon further guidance from Wisconsin DHS. - The Wisconsin National Guard is conducting drive-thru COVID-19 testing sites in Racine County at the following locations:
 - Wednesdays through March 10, 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. at the Racine County Fairgrounds, 19805 Durand Ave., Union Grove. Vehicles should enter the fairgrounds from Main Street.
 - Thursdays through March 4, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. at Festival Hall, 5 Fifth St., Racine. Vehicles should enter at 11th Street and Main Street.
