COVID-19 cases

United States: 31,700,126 deaths, 567,422 deaths

Wisconsin: 590,831 confirmed, 2,803,121 negative, 6,710 deaths

- The federal review of the Johnson & Johnson COVID-19 vaccine is continuing. The Wisconsin DHS reported Friday that vaccine providers should not administer the J&J vaccine at this time.
- As of today, April 19, 36.9 percent of Racine County residents have received at least one dose, while 24.7 percent of Racine County residents have completed the vaccine series.

 The Wisconsin National Guard continues to conduct drive-thru COVID-19 testing at Festival Hall in the City of Racine on Mondays from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. Pre-register by visiting https://register.covidconnect.wi.gov/en-US/.
