
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
Overview and Background

The goal of the Community Health Assessment (CHA) is to collect, review, and analyze health data in the community. This report helps us understand the health status of our community and the factors that impact health.

*Please note: Racine County Public Health Division (RCPH) serves all of Racine County except the City of Racine which is served by the City of Racine Public Health Department (CoRHD).



To develop the CHA, RCPH used the Mobilizing for Action through Planning and Partnerships (MAPP) framework to isolate and collect data, determine health issues, and identify existing assets and resources.



To achieve a comprehensive community health assessment, the CHA organizing and development process included participation of partners representing various sectors of the community.

Community residents, agencies and workgroups contributed to the planning and development of the community health assessment.

Data for the 2023 CHA was chosen based on survey results, a data review, and RCPH programming experience.





Ranked Health Issues

The <u>Racine County Health Needs Assessment</u> (Partner Survey) presents a summary of public health priorities for Racine County as identified in 2020 and reported in 2021 by a range of providers, policy makers, and other local experts and community members (key informants).

The <u>Racine County Community Health Survey Summary Report</u> (Community Health Survey) represents responses from 566 adults 18 years and older surveyed from a pool of 2,820 addresses from Racine County. Survey results were collected and reported in 2020.







<u>Wisconsin 211</u> is a 24-7 statewide helpline of local resources, information and referrals. Data was provided by Wisconsin 211 at the request of Racine County Public Health.

As seen in the data provided, decreases in rental assistance needs, a large increase in shelter inquires, homelessness inquires and an increasing need for food assistance exposes some potential indicators of an increasing struggle within the local population regarding secure housing and food/meals.



RCPH Jurisdiction Population Percentage by Ethnicity






RCPH Jurisdiction Population Percentage by Race













Percent of Children in Out-of-Home Placement - Racine County




Percent of Children in Out-of-Home Placement - Wisconsin








Arsenic and nitrate can be found in drinking water. Arsenic occurs naturally in rocks and soil across Wisconsin. Small amounts can dissolve into groundwater that may be used for drinking water. Nitrate is a compound that naturally occurs and has many human-made sources such as fertilizers used on yards, animal waste and many others.








Respiratory Infections* Were Over 95% of Confirmed and Probable Communicable Disease Cases in Racine County from 2021 thru 2022








Suicide Rates Number of deaths due to suicide per 100,000 population. (2016–2020)








Number of Suicide Deaths by Method and Age Group













- RCPH provides routine immunizations to the community.

 - o preventable hospitalizations
 - clinical care for uninsured

- RCPH works with health care systems, schools, and businesses.
- Areas of focus
 - poor physical/mental health days
 - o access to care
 - broadband access



Other Prevention

- RCPH leads collaborative teams that focus on suicide prevention, child and infant mortality, and overdose review and prevention.
- Areas of focus
 - suicide
 - o premature death
 - child and infant mortality
 - drug overdose deaths
