

How to Find a Doctor



If you need to find a doctor and are unsure where to start, follow these easy steps:

If you have private insurance, Medicare, or Medicaid:

Step 1:

Find your insurance company's contact information

- **On your insurance card:** Look on the back of the card for a phone number.
- **On the website:** Visit your insurance provider's website and look for "Find a Doctor" or "Contact Us."
- **On your insurance app:** Some insurance companies have apps where you can contact them or search for doctors.

Step 2:

Call or use online tools

- **Call customer service:** Call the number on your insurance card and ask for help finding a doctor.
- **Use the website:** Use the online directory to search for a doctor.

Step 3:

Provide your information

When contacting your insurance provider, be ready to tell them:

- Your full name and date of birth
- Your insurance plan details (plan name and/or ID number)
- Your zip code or preferred location for your doctor search

Step 4:

Choose a doctor

Once you have a list of available doctors, review their details such as:

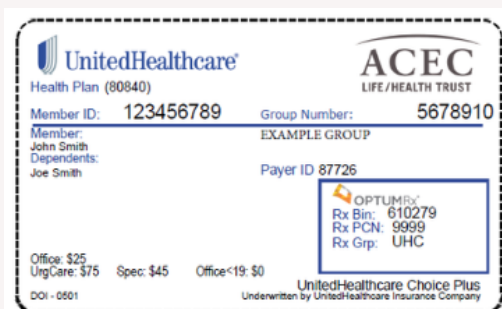
- Office hours and location
- Availability to accept new patients

Step 5:

Schedule an appointment

After selecting your doctor, call their office directly to confirm they are accepting new patients and schedule your appointment. Your insurance provider may also help with the scheduling process, depending on your plan.
